ST. MARY ACRE TEST RESULTS:

The ACRE (Assessment of Children/Youth Religious Education) helps schools, parishes, and diocesan leaders evaluate the faith, knowledge, and attitudes of students. Students take the ACRE test in 5th, 8th, and 11th grade. The 2O22-23 results are a testament to the importance of the ongoing faith education that is provided daily at St. Mary. When comparing St. Mary students' test results to the national average for students who do not attend Catholic school, but do attend Faith Formation classes through their parishes, St. Mary students score 20% higher or better.

Teachers and staff use these results to make improvements in our religion curriculum and our teaching strategies each year.

Zach Dunn was accepted into the Commonwealth Honors Academy at Murray State University. This competitive and challenging academic program brings together highachieving students who have completed their junior year from across the state to live and learn while taking college-level honors courses, participating in field trips, and learning from professionals.



High school students Bradyn Barnett and Zayna Yazigi were selected to participate in the HOBY Youth Leadership seminar for four days at Berea College. The mission of HOBY is to inspire and prepare future young leaders for a life dedicated to leadership, service, and innovation.

All St. Mary 8th grade students took the Pre-ACT and their results showed that 100% of them hit the benchmark to be college ready in Math and 96% hit the benchmark for college readiness in Reading!

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The St. Mary Elementary Quick Recall team placed 2nd in the district, 13 students placed at the district level, and 7 students placed at the Regional level. Additionally, 4th grader James Paxton placed within the top 10 students in the state on the arts and humanities test. He was the only student in our region of 16 schools who achieved this!

Middle school student Lucas Lea placed 1st in the State of Kentucky 4-H Speech Competition in the 12-year old division for his speech titled "Life with my uncle with Down Syndrome". Middle Schoolers Sophie Stratemeyer and Emma Dee competed in the Academic Team Governor's Cup State Finals in Louisville, KY. Sophie earned 6th place in the state in the science assessment category. Emma finished in the top 15% statewide in the written composition category. Both Boys and Girls Varsity Cross Country teams made the KHSAA State Tournament with the Lady Vikings placing 4th in the State of Kentucky.

Not only was DeeDee a parent at St. Mary, she also worked in the school office and loved getting to interact with the children at the school.
