G-Suite Permission Emails: In the past week or so, you have probably gotten two emails from Mrs. Eleanor Spry, our director, asking you to sign for permission for your student to have a Google account. All of our computers and tablets at the elementary school run on Google. They are Chromeboxes and Chromebooks. Most classes are scheduled for Computer Lab twice a week. Students without accounts will not be able to participate in that class. Without an account, your student will not be able to participate in many learning activities including iXL, MAP testing, typing programs, Xtra Math, and Lego Robotics activities. 3rd through 5th graders will not have access to online activities for Science and Social Studies.

Tuesday Morning Mass: On most Tuesday mornings, at 8:05 a.m., Kindergarten through Fifth Grade celebrates Mass in our school library. The area priests take turns presiding over the masses. Classes take turns preparing and carrying out duties at the masses. Parents, grandparents and guests are always welcome. (Please refer to the calendar on our website or the monthly calendar for the exact mass schedule as sometimes our school mass is replaced by a system mass or by reconciliation.)

Pick Up Line: Please remember to display your family name card in your front windshield. In the interest of safety, parents are asked to remain in their vehicles. If your student is not in the library when you come through the line, you will need to circle around, park, come in and get your student. PIE Non-Uniform Days: Our volunteer group, Partners in Education (PIE), sponsors Non-Uniform Days monthly on the third Wednesday of the month. - All dresses, skirts, skorts, and shorts must be no more than 5" from the floor when measured from a kneeling position.
- Pants must be proper fitting - no sagging nor can they be too tight or short.
- Leggings, jeggings, yoga pants, and spandex are not permitted.
- Clothes must be neat and clean and free of rips and holes.
- All rules for shoes still apply due to safety issues.
- No caps, toboggans, or head coverings, unless it's part of a theme day

Spirit Shirt Fridays: Every Friday is a Logo Day in the elementary school. Students may wear shirts purchased from the Spirit Shop with their uniform bottoms.

Handbook Changes for Elementary: The main change to the school handbook which affects the elementary school is the following:

Cell Phones: It is sometimes necessary for elementary students to bring cellphones to school so they will have them for after school activities. These phones need to stay in the student backpacks and turned off while in the school building. Cell phones should not be brought to school for Show-n-Tell. *Use of smartwatches which have cellular capabilities is not acceptable in the elementary school. It is also not allowable to connect these smartwatches to the school wifi.*
